COMMUNICATION VIA 'CONNECT'

Last year a few parents indicated through the school survey that they would like better communication between teacher and parent, especially those of you that are working full time. I have looked into a Department of Education initiative called 'Connect'. Basically, **Connect** is a secure internet service that will allow teachers to provide teaching and learning activities in their child's classroom directly to the parents. Participation in **Connect** is entirely optional for parents. If you would like to take part you will require internet access and a computer. No additional software is required. The Department of Education will issue you with a unique user name and password which will provide you with access to Connect.

Initially, **Connect** will allow Mr Hill and Miss Pateman to provide general class information to you about the teaching and learning activities that their class are undertaking. In the future, the service may be further developed to allow more flexible communication between parents and teachers as well as providing personalised information about your child's learning activities and progress.

At the moment, we are beginning the trial of **Connect** in Mr Hill and Miss Pateman's Year 5 class. They will be trialling the service to see how well it works to improve parent/teacher communication. By trialling, we will be able to identify strengths and weaknesses of the service. If it serves our purpose well, then we hope to roll this out to other classes over the year.

Some teachers do currently have an email communication system. We hope this **Connect** service may provide a uniform service across the school.
