"Students developed a large scale tree growing and planting program and are now growing and planting 9,000 trees each year while learning to make a positive contribution to their community," he said.

Congratulations to Cornelia Major who nominated the school for the award and herself received a Highly Commended Award for Volunteering and we thank her for her continuing efforts to promote the environmental work we do at Ardross. The school received a certificate, a collection of books for the School Library and \$2000.

#### WATERWISE TIP - EARLY IN THE MORNING IS BEST

Water only once on your watering day, ideally early in the morning (plants do not absorb water during darkness), so that gardens are charged with the water they need during the warmest part of the day. During autumn and spring our gardens only need to be watered once a week. With cooler nights, morning dew and low evaporation, your garden will retain the moisture it needs. When rain is forecast or if it is has rained, remember to turn off your reticulation. During the cooler winter months, lawns and many European plants are dormant so they need very little water. Usually the rainfall received during our mild winters is enough and any more just tends to promote weed growth.
