# Principal's Message

#### **Yarloop Excursion**

On 14 June the Year 5 students from Rooms 2 and 3, staff members and parent volunteers had the opportunity to travel to Yarloop to plant approximately 2000 shrubs and trees. We met with Mr Ivers, Rachel Cook – US Consulate General and Mrs Dale Tilbrook, Aboriginal presenter to begin our day. We split into two groups and rotated between tree planting and Aboriginal Culture. Working together in groups of eight we worked hard as a team to plant trees and shrubs and to ensure the plants survive their new environment. The other half of our group experienced Aboriginal Culture with Mrs Dale Tilbrook. We learnt about how the Aboriginal people made adhesive with charcoal, kangaroo dung and native plants.

I would like to acknowledge the exceptional behaviour of our students. They embraced our school values of environmental responsibility and showed respect and concern for others and their rights.

## SCHOOL ENROLMENTS

Friday 21 July is an important date in your child's education. Families need to apply to enrol their children in a public school for 2018 if they are:

- starting Kindergarten 4 years old by 30 June 2018
- starting Pre-primary (first year of compulsory school) 5 years old by 30 June 2018
- starting Year 7 (first year of secondary school)
- changing schools.
