2026 SCHOOL CHARGES AND VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

The Ardross Primary School Board has endorsed the following schedule of School Charges and Voluntary Contributions for 2026. The schedule is broken into four sections and will allow you to calculate all possible costs that you might incur throughout the next school year.

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

a) Voluntary School Contribution to support Curriculum Areas:

The School Board has reviewed our school Voluntary Contributions. The amount parents/carers are asked to pay has been maintained at the \$60 maximum set in the School Education Regulations 2000.

Money collected will be used to supplement school expenditure in curriculum focus areas. While these contributions are voluntary, the quality of our teaching and learning program will be maximised when each family makes its contribution to the cost of supplementing funding gained from other sources, including the State and Commonwealth Governments.

VOLUNTARY APPROVED REQUESTS

b) Voluntary P&C Contribution:

Other voluntary approved funds at Ardross Primary School include P&C Contributions of \$50 per student. This voluntary contribution is administered by the P&C Committee and used to fund and support school initiatives and focus areas that meet the needs of our children. The P&C hosts activities, events and fundraising initiatives throughout the school year and operates the Uniform Shop located on the school grounds.

c) Voluntary Student Well-being Officer Contribution:

The Ardross Primary School Well-being Officer, formerly known as the Chaplain, plays a vital role in supporting student well-being. Voluntary Contributions help us add an extra day of support, enhancing the government funding we receive in this area.

MAXIMUM CHARGE FOR INCURSIONS AND EXCURSIONS

This table shows the **maximum** amount the school can charge for excursions/incursions throughout the year of 2026. Each item is capped at a certain amount and endorsed by the school finance committee and school board.

Parents can choose to pay-as-you-go for charges OR can choose to pay up front a portion of the estimated costs for the year, per child, per year level. Any unallocated balance in your child’s account at the end of the school year will automatically roll over to the following year. You can obtain your child’s credit balance or request a refund of the credit at any time during the year by contacting the front office. On leaving the school your child’s balance can be refunded or transferred to a sibling.

Excursion details and permissions will be sent to parents and payments can be made using CompassPay. Alternatively, you can pay using cash or EFTPOS at the front office. Qkr will no longer be a payment option.
