



Year 4 Chromebook BYOD Program: How to Add Additional Users

Parents can create different Google accounts to allow for home use and monitor them through the Google Family Link App. Parents should first set-up their own personal Google account and set themselves as Administrators.

If you're setting up parental controls for the first time, make sure your Chromebook is updated to ChromeOS version 71 or higher.

The Google Family Link app can be used with Chromebooks with ChromeOS version 71 or higher. The Google Family Link app will enable parents to set all restrictions.

To add additional users to your Chromebook, follow the steps below:

1. If you're signed into your Chromebook, sign out.
 1. On your Chromebook, at the bottom right, select the time.
 2. Select Power  > Sign out .
2. At the bottom, select **Add person**.
3. On the "**Choose your setup**" screen, select one of the 3 options:
 1. **For personal use**
 2. **For a child**
 3. **For work or school**
4. Select **Next**.
5. Follow the on-screen instructions.

How Chromebooks work with your child's Google Account

Children signed in to their Google Account on a Chromebook have a similar experience to adults. Features may be updated from time to time, but some differences include:

- Children can't [browse in private](#).
- You can [manage which websites](#) children can visit in Chrome, and limit their ability to [grant permissions](#) to websites.
- You can set Chrome to block sexually explicit and violent sites.

- Your child's [Google Activity controls](#) may allow Google to use Chrome browsing history and activity from websites to personalise your child's experience across Google products and services. However, this info won't be used to personalise ads for children under 13.
