Principal's Message





The 'hot and dry' was characterised by the onset of hot easterly winds. The signals of this season were the Christmas and paper bark trees blossoming. Noongar people burnt mosaic sections of scrubland through fire-stick farming. This forced animals into the open to hunt and opened the canopy to the November rains, which increased germination of summer foodstuffs. An abundance of food was found along the coastal lakes and river estuaries. The mullet, bream, marron and crabs were fat and ready for harvest. Colours of this season are green, blue, orange and yellow.

Welcome to Term 4. We are looking forward to an exciting term, jam-packed with teaching, learning, and celebrations.

We continue to welcome new families to our school and community. The children are settling in, making friends and enjoying learning.

On behalf of the whole school community, I thank everyone who gives their time to support all the children at Ardross Primary School including the School Board and Class Representatives. Thank you to the parents and children who ensure our 'hens' and 'frog pond' are looked after during the holiday break; and also the P&C and family members who help in classes as well as make cakes for the Athletics Carnival cake stall, it does not go unnoticed.

2026 STUDENT PLACEMENTS

Ardross PS Classroom Placement Guidelines

If your child/ren will NOT be attending Ardross PS in 2026, please complete the tear-off slip and return to the front office ASAP.

As the Principal, I have the discretion to place students in classes. I will work with staff to discuss the placement of students in classes for the 2026 academic year. Student placements will be based on the teachers' professional judgements of each child, taking into consideration academic, social, and emotional needs.

In order to ensure that the process is open, equitable, and transparent for all, the following criteria will be applied to place all students in classes. Factors that are considered in the placement of students include: • academic performance • work habits, e.g. ability to work independently • behaviour • gender • social network and social maturity • special considerations, e.g. twins, siblings, medical or disability factors.

Parents with critical or relevant information regarding their child's 2026 placement should advise me in writing at susan.mikkelsen@education.wa.edu.au. Specific requests for class placement for 2026 must be received by 3.10pm on Friday, 31 October 2025.

KISS AND DRIVE

As with most schools, we have a dedicated zone to drop students off and pick them up. To ensure the <u>safety of all students</u> and the community, we have a Kiss and Drive system, which ensures traffic flow and safety.

It is essential that you adhere to these guidelines. Each afternoon, the Deputy Principals will monitor this area to ensure cars move seamlessly and our students are safe. It is unacceptable that some adults, when asked to move on, are disrespectful and aggressive towards our staff.

Please take the time to read the following notice regarding our Kiss and Drive system. There are parking restrictions around our school. The signs are very clear and must be adhered to for the safety of our students and staff. The staff car park is only for staff teaching / working at the school. Within this area, we also have one disability parking space and a P&C bay.

The Kiss and Drive on Drumfern Street operates daily in the morning and afternoon for dropping off or picking up students. Parking and leaving your vehicle is not permitted during the specified times. Please find attached the Kiss and Drive policy and pass it on to any family member who will be collecting your child/children.

You must find an alternative parking bay if your child needs assistance with car restraints, placing large items. When using the Kiss and Drive area, drivers cannot exit the car. Students must have bags with them and should not go to the car boot to place items.

We have officers from Melville Council who consistently frequent the area during peak times to ensure the safety of all.
