Principal's Message

You might like to walk through our front native garden and smell the scents from the eucalyptus trees. Again, thank you for ensuring your child/ren arrive at school ready to learn. Their enthusiasm for learning, smiles, and hellos in the morning are contagious.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

It is a joy to meet with all Year 6 Student Captains at the Yarning Circle in our front native bushland. We even had birds come and listen to our conversation. The Captains share the best thing about their role and also any concerns they are having.

One on their concerns is that younger students are not listening to them. Today I have had a meeting with all students from Years 1 to 6 to discuss the importance of a safe learning environment and behaviour expectations. You might like to ask your child what was one thing I spoke about.

The Year 6 students were also presented with their leavers' shirts, which they proudly wear.

PRINCIPAL OF THE DAY

It was a pleasure having Macy Lim as the 'Principal of the Day' last Tuesday. She was so proud to nominate a 'Rule of the Day' that gave students five minutes of extra play at lunchtime. She also enjoyed pizza with two of her friends and sharing Principal stickers with well-deserving students. This is an excellent initiative from the P&C, which I look forward to every year. WORKS AT THE SCHOOL

The Kindergarten ceiling restoration is now complete. During this time we also took the opportunity to paint the walls.

SWIMMING LESSONS

CITY OF MELVILLE - RECONCILIATION

The City of Melville is committed to reconciliation within our organisation and community. Their vision for reconciliation is a country that values the living cultures of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, embraces truthful reflection of the history and experiences of First Nations peoples, and is dedicated to equity, opportunity and respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

Looking around the park at the top of Wireless Hill, Noongar elder Christine Reich doesn't just see old installations from when it was a World War II communications centre. "To me, it's called Yagan Mia," she said. "Since my grandparents let us know [that].

Yagan Mia is one of 14 place names in the Melville area that have been decoded and translated by a group of Noongar traditional owners to create a record of Aboriginal life in the places that have become Perth's southern suburbs.

The project, a collaboration between the Community Arts Network of Western Australia, Indigenous consultancy Moodjar and the City of Melville, has been running for the past two years.
