#### **KISS AND DRIVE**

Fortunately, we have a dedicated zone to drop students off and pick them up. Unfortunately, this area can be unsafe for our students. We have a Kiss and Drive system, which ensures traffic flow and safety. Thank you for adhering to the guidelines.

Please take the time to read the following notice regarding our Kiss and Drive system:

Please note there are parking restrictions around our school. The signs are very clear and must be adhered to for the safety of our students and staff. The staff car park is only for staff teaching at the school. Within this area, we also have one disability parking and a P&C bay.

The Kiss and Drive on Drumfern St operates daily in the morning and afternoon for dropping off or picking up students. <u>Parking and leaving your vehicle is not permitted during the specified times.</u>

Please find attached the Kiss and Drive policy and pass it on to any family member who will be collecting your child/children.

You must find an alternative parking bay if your child needs assistance with car restraints. When using the Kiss and Drive area, drivers cannot exit the car. Students must have bags with them and should not go to the car boot to place items.

We have officers from Melville Council who consistently frequent the area during peak times to ensure the safety of all.

## THE WORLD'S OLDEST LIVING CULTURE

Australia's South West is an ancient land and home to one of the world's oldest living cultures, with the Noongar Aboriginal peoples connection to Boodja (Country) dating back more than 50, 000 years. Conservationists by nature, they were semi-nomadic, following changes in the landscape represented by a six season calendar, still used by Aboriginal people today.

#### SIX SEASONS

The six Noongar seasons – Birak, Bunuru, Djeran, Makuru, Djilba and Kambarang – represent the seasonal changes we see across the South West annually, and can be indicated by weather patterns, food availability, and changes in flora and fauna.

"Each season has a plant indicator that flowers in advance of each change," says <u>Koomal Dreaming</u>'s Josh Whiteland. "Plants, animals and weather patterns coincide with each season, which runs for the duration of every second full moon. This determines where to forage, gather, hunt and camp."

While visiting Australia's South West, we ask that you care for Boodja (Country).



#### **CITY OF MELVILE - RECONCILIATION**

The City of Melville is committed to reconciliation within our organisation and community. Their vision for reconciliation is a country that values the living cultures of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, embraces truthful reflection of the history and experiences of First Nations peoples, and is dedicated to equity, opportunity and respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities. Weaving together community-held knowledge and academic research, **Place Names** uncovers and unpacks the original meanings of Noongar placenames in the City of Melville, and harnesses contemporary art forms to celebrate Noongar language, heritage and culture.
