# **Chaplain's Corner**

#### **SORRY!**

(Note: I wrote this about 3 years ago, and I still find myself getting stuck when it comes to understanding and activating 'apology' with children. A refresher for all, I say!)

## THE LANGUAGE OF APOLOGY - PART 1

Helping children to know when to apologise and how to apologise might be a little trickier than we first thought. It seems that the word 'sorry' translates slightly differently for everyone who says or hears it. In fact, when I help children resolve a conflict that's happened between them at school, we often talk about what 'sorry' means – is it a solution? Or an admission of wrong doing? Or a commitment to working things out together? Or a 'line in the sand' that tells us that what happened is already behind us?

It turns out that it probably means *all* of these in general, but usually only one or two to us individually. Gary Chapman and Jennifer Thomas (*The Five Languages of Apology*) have looked at *what* we are trying to say when we apologies and have distilled the language down to five categories of apology. Now, I hasten to add that it's simply a guide and not a script-book, because every child and every family is wonderfully unique ... but I reckon they have come pretty close to deciphering what we are trying to say when we apologise.

According to Chapman and Thomas, the five languages of apology are:

- expressing regret at what happened;
- accepting responsibility for what happened;
- > making amends for what was done;
- genuinely changing themselves and how they behave;
- > requesting forgiveness from the wronged person/people.

Expressing regret – Regret is a negative emotional response to a decision or action of our own. It says "I did something that I wish I didn't do." It's different to disappointment, mainly because it's about things we have control over – the weather might be disappointing, but it's out of a child's control, whereas lying or saying something hurtful are linked to regret, as both are actions the

child can control. Regret also hints at our values - we have fallen short of who we think we really are.

How do we say it? "I'm sorry" is the norm, but other phrases might include "I wish I hadn't done that" and "That's not who I am; I'm sorry I did that."

Next column, we'll delve into the other 4 styles of apology. But let this question linger: what do *you* want to hear when you have been wronged? What does it mean? And within your household, who is different, and how can we nurture their own language of apology?
